

Apart from the executive committee, ULPHAT is always graced by impassioned medical and non-medical volunteers. These volunteers contribute in various course of actions; which include assisting patients, channelizing treatment, coordinating information and also collecting funds.

HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2016

The journey of ULPHAT and Pakistan Navy partnership free medical camps continued in 2016 as well. We were successfully able to conduct 11 free medical camps in Baba Island, Damb Lasbella, Gandani and Abdul Rehman Goth in which 8718 patients were treated. Our team included specialties like pediatrics, OBGYN, Medicine, Surgery, Dermatology and Ophthalmology.

The camp at Abdul Rehman Goth was notable because it was a joint venture by four organizations. Humanity Initiative and ULPHAT arranged medicines and medical personnel for the medical camp while Divers Reef Karachi provided the logistical support and assured support from the community representatives of this fishing village. Haji Rang Elahi hospital joined hands as well to serve patients with eye diseases and problems at the camp. Health education was also provided by Humanity Initiative volunteers to help promote healthy habits in the community.

Like every year, ULPHAT went to Al Mohsin Orphanage and opened the fast with the children and distributed Eid suits and shoes. We tried to play our part in bringing a smile on their faces and spreading joy around the time of Eid for these kids who are deprived of living in a family.

ULPHAT also provided individual treatment to 87 children for various issues. Most of these children come from humble backgrounds where the father is a vegetable cart owner, fisherman or daily wage earner which makes it really difficult for them to get their child treated even for complicated issues like Tetralogy of Fallot. One such case was that of Ammar Altaf, an 11 years old boy from Jangpur - Rahim Yar Khan. He had been suffering from Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF) for the past 11 years but the family was unable to afford his treatment. He got treated through Ulphat and is on his road to recovery.

ULPHAT WELFARE ORGANIZATION NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2016

1 NATURE OF OPERATION

The society was registered as Ulphat Welfare Organization on May 25, 2010 under the voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registeration and Control) Ordinance 1961. The registered office of the society is A-159, Block N, North Nazimabad, Karachi. The society is engaged for helping needy persons, specially children who require urgent surgery and can not afford quality intervention and post operative care. Ulphat also provide ration to the needy during Ramzan and other times in a year.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Statement Of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of International Accounting Standards.

2.2 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

2.3 Cash & Cash Equivalent

Cash and cash equivalents are carried at cost. For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash in hand and deposits held with banks.

2.4 Revenue

Donations received are presented at the time of receipt i.e. when received as cash or deposited in the bank account.

Donations restricted in its use, are utilised for the specified purpose and are classified as donations under restricted fund account. Any income made from such restricted donations is also credited directly in the restricted fund account

2.5 Expenses

All expenses are recognised in the income and expenditure account on accrual basis. Expenses incurred out of donation are reflected in the income and expenditure account, with an equal amount being recognised as "Value of services rendered".


